


Development Cooperation in AP


In December 2014, it was proposed to establish a TUDCN for the Asia Pacific region to ensure trade union organisations from the region working together on development cooperation.

This was endorsed by the ITUC-AP RGC in 2015.








Working Poverty



World and Asia: Population Weighted Income Inequality






Level and Composition of Tax Revenues and Social Spending, 2010






ITUC Global Rights index (55 AP countries)
